lowing a conference with Mayor Shaw at which reports were considered which showed that sex crimes have increased steadily in the last three years.

"The functions of this new bureau will be twofold," the Chief declared. "First, the classification of all sex offenders including fingerprints and photographs. Second, a psychiatric examination will be made of all sex offenders with the object of recommending to the court the proper correctional as well as

the punitive procedure for their rehabilitation." CASE HISTORIES

By the use of the classification system case histories will be accumulated to provide clues for the identification of future major sex criminals, the Chief explained.

jor sex criminals, the Chief explained. "An important phase of this work will be the card indexing of methods of operation of each

individual offender," he said. "It has been proven over a long period of police experience that all criminals use certain characteristic methods of committing crimes, and the indexing of these individual 'trademarks' has been invaluable in linking a se-

ries of criminal acts to one particular offender." AID TO COURTS

Herctofore psychiatric examination of sex offenders has been ordered by the court only in special cases as a condition of probation. Under the new program each judge will have a copy of the bureau's report at the time the offender is first brought before him for plea, thus aiding prompt corrective measures.

All information compiled by the bureau will be available to all other law enforcement aggregies within the courty the

the bureau will be available to all other law enforcement agencies within the county, the Chief said, and should prove highly valuable in combatting any future wave of sex crimes.
